Purpose:

Great attention has been paid to English Medium Instruction (EMI) in higher education since the Taiwan Government announced its bilingual policy by 2030. Numerous universities and colleges have made attempts to promote internationalization through EMI practices. How can a language university develop its strategic plan to encourage EMI at the meso (policy) and micro (classroom) levels? How have EMI implementations been made in various disciplines, particularly in the social sciences and humanities? How can EMI meet the needs of multiple stakeholders, specifically teachers and students?
